1. **Welcome, introduction and apologies-** Welcome Danielle the Co-chair from Fremantle Early Learning Centre.
2. **Approval of minutes of meeting 27 May 2016**
The minutes were approved without change.
3. **Update on actions arising from the minutes**
 - a) **Gazebo- ACTION:** Danielle raised a concern in relation to the Gazebo in that it would provide shelter for homeless and drug users. Suggest a wider consultation occur before this is progressed further.
 - b) **Sign – ACTION:** Discussed with Bev-to provide advice on CoF style guide and the process or detail required to pass on to the graphic designer.
4. **SWMPF Leadership Group**
 - a. A number of actions from the Leadership group include agreement from the statutory bodies to meet regarding disengaged young people, connection between unregistered tenants and drug distribution.
 - b. Planning session has been delayed following Karin resignation. The new Executive Director has been selected and will commence work on 18 July. .

- c. The additional grant money will be used for direct project support. Suggested a youth worker for Davis Park. To be confirmed by Leadership group.

5. Working group member updates

- a. PCYC- Impact100 grant was unsuccessful. Feedback indicated the project focus was too restricted. PCYC has commenced a Certificate I Leadership. JG to circulate selection criteria.
- b. SMYL – Try-a-Trade during National Skills Week (29 Aug-4 Sept). Date to be advised next meeting. Other agencies and services encouraged to exhibit or participate.
- c. FELC – Danielle raised a number of issues in connection with drug taking and inappropriate behaviour outside the child care centre. She has met with council and written to Minister for Housing etc and will continue to campaign through every avenue.
- d. Housing Authority commented on recent positive outcome with a problematic tenancy. Housing is continuing to work on a couple of other problematic tenancies with the Police. Matthew also stated that residents should, where possible contact the HA disruptive behaviour line with issues of disruptive behaviour. Calls highlighted ongoing issues and allowed Housing to allocate staff more appropriately.
